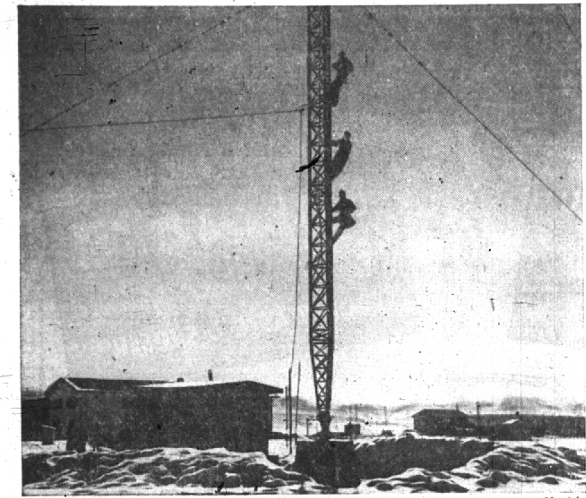

Church Being Moved to New Site This Week

Movers began work on the Church of the Nazarene Monday, preparatory to moving it from its Forest-Woodward location to the recently purchased site at West Lincoln and Edgewood. The 48x64 foot structure was loaded onto the dollies and moved Tuesday by the Goetz company.

The Rev. William G. Ardrey said permission was granted after an extensive study of building weights and street lengths had been made.

He said services Sept. 23, 30 and Oct. 7 would be held in the Village Players building off Chestnut street.

"We will be back in our own building the second Sunday in October," Rev. Ardrey said.

The church was built in 1896 by the United Presbyterians. Its sloping floor, giving the entire congregation a full view of the pulpit, was one of the outstanding architectural features of the building.

The building was purchased in 1950 by the Church of the Nazarene.


