### Subdivision Offers to Settle for \$2,949

An offer to pay only \$2,949.28 of a proposed \$19,500 deficiency reassessment for paving was presented to the city commission Monday evening by residents of the Birmingham Estates subdivision.

They gave commissioners figures reporting to show the reassessment should not be more than this smaller amount for paving, excavation and curb replacement and straightening which was the outgrowth of a special assessment district created in 1947.

The original assessment called for residents to pay \$34,650.86 but the project cost \$34,886.56, according to figures from City

"As I see it, you residents have two justifiable reasons for complaint—over the length of time it took to put the paving in, as well as the final cost of the improvement," Mayor Dean G. Beyer said at the hearing on the deficiency contract was awarded.

COMMISSIONERS asked that the city manager be given three weeks to check city records for the answers to these questions. The subdivision group agreed to the postponement.

It was apparent that the principal concern in the subdivision's mind was why the city permitted the project to exceed original estimates by more than 50 per cent and why the group was not appraised of the higher costs before

Everett W. Allen, chairman of the Birmingham branch YMCA Christian emphasis committee said Dr. Harold Blake Walker of Evanston, Ill. and Dr. Arnold Runkel of Birmingham will be the two speakers for the thirty-third annual religious retreat of the Detroit YMCAs.

The retreat will be held Saturday, Oct. 6 from 3:30 to 9 p.m. at Clark church near Colchester, Ont.

Dr. Walker is pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Evanston. He is the author of two outstanding religious works, "Going God's Way" and "Ladder of Light."

A FORMER Associated Press editor and writer, he now serves as a member of the board of directors of the Presbyterian Tribune, and is a member of the national commission on evangelism and the board of foreign missions of the Presbyterian Church of the United States.

Dr. Runkel, minister of Birmingham's First Methodist church, is a graduate of the University of Michigan and Cincinnati Bible Seminary. He received his Doctorate of Divinity at Albion College in June, 1920.

A special committee has been appointed by the Troy township board to take care of the enforcement details concerning the new hunting ban in that area.

A referendum by the residents this spring approved the prohibiting of hunting in Troy. Members of the committee are Township Clerk Clifton Truesdell, Geville Mason and George Ford.

Superintendent Benjamin Hardard said the township is completely posted with no hunting signs.

Board members saw a demonstration of tape and wire recording equipment. Township zoning board has requested the equipment for use for public hearings.

Hardard stated that the zoning board will be advised of the matter was deferred until the next meeting.

According to a release from the Foster Parents Plan in New York, Everett Edward Fisher, 1000 S. Woodward, has become the adopted father of Madeleine Eugénie, 8-year-old Belgian war orphan.

Madeline is now one of the numerous European children in the United States where she is being supported by PLAN.

The Foster Parents plan does not do mass relief work. Each child under their care is treated as an individual and "adoption" is financial, not legal.

THE FOSTER parents promise to contribute \$15 monthly for the care of the child for at least one year.

"Correspondence is encouraged through the Plan office," the release states, "as it gives these unfortunate children a sense of belonging to someone and having some person who really cares about them and their welfare."

### New Commemorative Stamp Issued by Post Office Dept.

A three-cent stamp commemorating the 75th anniversary of the American Chemical society was issued by the post office department through the New York post office, Sept. 4, according to Leonard E. Fowler, Birmingham postmaster.

The stamp is 0.84 by 1.14 inches in dimensions, arranged horizontally, with a double line border, and the color is maroon. For its center design, the stamp has the emblem of the American Chemical Society.

Fowler said, "Stamp collectors desiring first-day cancellations of this stamp may send a limited number of addresses, involving not more than 10, to the Postmaster, New York, N. Y., with money order remittance for the cost of the stamps to be affixed. Postage stamps and personal checks will not be accepted in payment."
