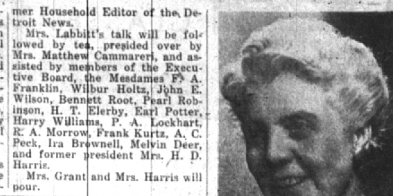
Myrtle Labbitt to Speak At Women's Club
