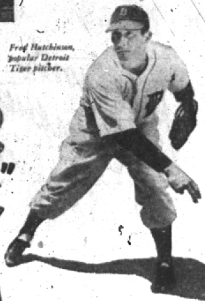

BOILED SALMON

Fred's Favorite

2 lb. piece fresh salmon
1 medium-sized onion sliced
3 sprigs parsley
The fish is absorbent. Put boiling water in deep water boiler. Add onion, carrot, parsley, clove, vinegar and salt. Turn switch to high heat. When water is boiling add fish. Turn switch to low and simmer (6 to 10 minutes per lb. depending on thickness). Remove salmon from stock, skin place on bed of creamed spinach.

1 whole clove
3 peas, vinegar
1 tbsp. salt
6 cups boiling water

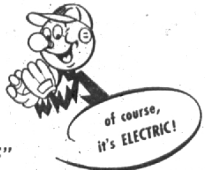
