Birmingham Park Street Patching Hearing Is Called

A public hearing on necessity will be held Monday, April 28, for the laying of asphaltic concrete on four streets in Birmingham Park subdivision.

The city commission Monday night instructed that the hearing be held for the improving of Hawthorne between Maple and Linden, Aspen between Maple and Hawthorne, Linden between Maple and Brandon and Brandon between Shirley and Linden.

THE ACTION followed a petition of property owners in the area a year ago asking for the improvement of all these streets with the exception of Brandon. A water survey and repair of water leaks has held up any work on the improvement.

City Manager Donald C. Egbert told commissioners that it should be understood that the work will be a patch job and not a complete reconstruction of the street surfaces.

Oakland Hospital Campaign Extended

Extension of Oakland Hospital's \$200,000 fund raising campaign to permit campaign workers to complete all contacts for solicitation, was announced by Merritt D. Hill, chairman.

Hill said that the program will be carried on through April and longer if necessary, so that full coverage of a selected list of industrial and private donors can be effected. He pointed out that many have not been reached because of absence either of vacations or business.

At the same time, the executive announced the drive will be intensified through the creation of a steering committee which will take an active part in coordinating the efforts of campaign workers.

The committee includes E. A. Tomlinson, president of Oakland Hospital, Franklin Pricker, vice president of Oakland Hospital, William E. Yaw, trustee, Mark N. Beach, executive director of the Greater Detroit Hospital Fund, and Walter Murphy and Frank Webb, members of the campaign's public relations committee.

MORE THAN \$60,000 in new funds have been contributed to the campaign in addition to substantial payments of former pledges to the South Oakland Hospital Authority.

In the latter program, letters have just been mailed to the signers of unpaid pledges by the South Oakland Hospital Authority requesting not only payment of the pledges but also an upward readjustment to compensate for inflation that has occurred since the pledges were made six years ago.

One of the largest single private contributions to the current campaign was the gift of \$6,682 from the Susan Leonard Fund, announced by Mr. and Mrs. Clare C. Leonard, parents of the four-year-old Berkeley child who died March 1.

In the continuing program to finish the financing of the hospital, campaign workers report a high percentage of active response to solicitations with few refusals on the part of prospective donors.

IT WAS INDICATED that the principal hurdle met with by the campaigners is in cases where the individual or firm solicited had
