4th Hole Longer At Sylvan Glen

A major change has been made in the first nine of the 18-hole Sylvan Glen golf course, which will open this weekend, according to Bill Carto, pro-manager.

The fourth hole, which has always been short for a par-five teat, has been lengthened into a full 505 yards. A new tee has been set into the woods directly behind the old one.

Carto said the whole layout has been remeasured and will play 6,110 yards from the regular tees. For tournament play it can be lengthened to 6,460.

He added that markers at 150, 200 and 250 yards have been placed on all of the holes.
