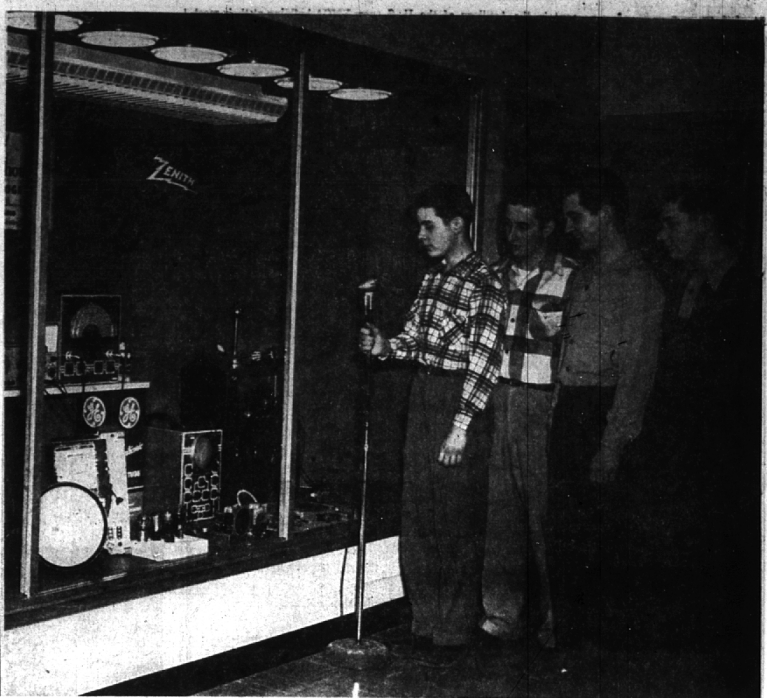

Those students fortunate enough to see the film were grateful for the opportunity. Many others expressed a desire to see it.



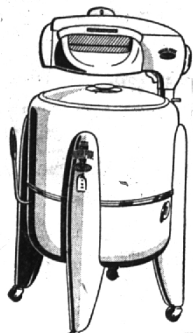
