

Theatre School To Open on June 23rd

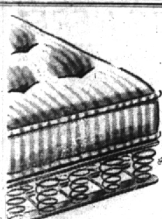
Plans are under way for the eleventh session of the Cranbrook Summer Theatre School which will start June 23 at the Cranbrook Greek Theatre.
