## LWV Panel to Discuss Voter Issues April 22

"The Citizens' View of '52," a forum designed to give voters a clear picture of the political issues at stake in the coming presidential election, is to be held on April 22 at 8 p.m. at the West Bloomfield township hall, 4460 Orchard Lake road.

Sponsored by the Interlake area League of Women Voters in cooperation with the Birmingham and Pontiac Leagues, the forum will present a panel of prominent citizens from this area who will lead discussions of basic issues—international and domestic—which face Americans in the 1952 election.

In over 700 cities across the nation, these non-partisan forums arranged by the National League of Women Voters will determine which election issues they want presented to the presidential candidates.

Appearing on the panel April 22 will be Russell Barnes, noted news analyst who lives at 788 Randall; George R. Hartrick, circuit court judge from Pontiac; Dr. Leslie Hechtel, pastor of the Kirk of the Hills in Bloomfield Hills; George Heliker, economics teacher at Wayne University, and William Alf, corporation lawyer from Detroit.

Mrs. Stanley Cain, president of the Michigan LWV, will act as moderator.

### Adopt New Method Of Destroying Unclaimed Dogs

Replying to Mr. and Mrs. Charles H. Fischer, 1030 West Lincoln, Chief of Police Moxley said this week a more humane method was being adopted immediately of disposing of unclaimed dogs at the Birmingham pound.

In a recent letter to Moxley, the Fischers protested the shooting of unwanted animals.

Moxley said the department had been considering a different system for some time and urged by the Fischer request, has hastened the decision.

In the future all animals will be disposed of by Dr. F. H. Gasow, DVM, who will use a hypodermic-administered poison, Moxley announced.

"WE HAVE considered several methods," Moxley said, "including electrocution and a gas chamber. We also considered taking the animals to Pontiac to be destroyed through the facilities of the Animal Welfare Shelter there."

"Having it done at Gasow's will be much kinder than having to transport the animals to Pontiac, especially in the case of an injured animal, for we do not have proper means of transportation."

Moxley went on to explain that although the dog warden is required to hold a stray dog no more than 72 hours, many are held much longer than this.

If dog warden Ralph Riley picks up a dog that is obviously a homeless animal, he holds it for 72 hours before destroying it, if the dog appears to have had a good home and to have been someone's pet, Riley makes every effort to return it or find another home for it.

"WHEN A DOG is wearing a tag, to return it is quite simple. We have files of all licensed dogs in Birmingham and check that when we pick up a licensed animal. If it has on an out-of-town tag, we contact other departments in locating the owners."

"We check all area newspapers for ads of lost dogs as well as checking the reports received at the department switchboard on lost animals."

"In the case of well-bred dogs, every possible effort is made to get them into a good home rather than kill it. We nearly always have a list of persons who want a pet, and when a dog has not been claimed in what we consider a reasonable time, we contact someone on this list to arrange an adoption."

"Regarding the destruction of dogs, we have felt for some time that another method should be used. The letter from the Fischers merely hastened our action on it."
