### April 21 Is Date For Public Sale Of City Property

Birmingham city commissioners have approved the sale at public auction of several lots on Sheffield and Cheltenham roads, Sheffield Estates No. 1 subdivision. The sale will be held at the municipal building, beginning at 10 a.m. City Assessor Elmer Haack has recommended a minimum bid of \$17,000 be considered. Bidders should be prepared to tender cash or a certified check for 10 percent of the purchase offer. The balance, together with interest at 6 percent is to be paid within nine months from date of contract.

THE PARCEL will be sold subject to easements and restrictions of record. The City of Birmingham reserves the right to use certain lots to the north and south of Lincoln avenue for public housing and other lots to the north of Lincoln for industrial purposes. All are within the subdivision.

### What Effect Would New Detroit Airport Have on Birmingham

Mayor Dean Beier is going to ask Rep. George A. Dondero to check with the Civil Aeronautics Authority to determine what effect the proposed City of Detroit airport at Dearborn and 12 Mile roads would have on Birmingham.

Birmingham officials have been asked by the City of Royal Oak to file a protest against the construction of the airport at this location. The Royal Oak protest is based on the fact that the location is near a rapidly growing section of the city and would bring with it the hazard of landings and take off over a heavily populated area.

They also protest the closing of the two highways, stating that this would throw a heavy traffic burden on other streets already carrying a capacity load.

### 2 Graduate From Naval Air School

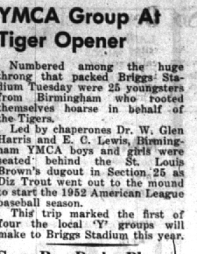

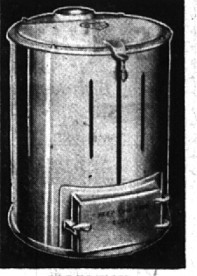
Lemke, who has been transferred to Whitley Island, Wash., entered Naval service Sept. 6, 1950.
