

Local Women Backs Annual Symphony Fund Campaign

The Detroit Symphony Orchestra's second annual Maintenance Fund Campaign opened this week with a goal of \$100,000 to be raised for the orchestra's support. Headline the campaign will be Mrs. Willis P. Wagner, for the Women's Association, and Jerome H. Remick, Jr., for the Men's Division.

Mrs. Leonard T. Lewis has been named Birmingham's Bloomfield Hills chairman. Working with her will be Mrs. John T. Eckenrode and Mrs. Robert Graham, co-chairmen.

Acting in an advisory capacity are Mrs. William Lloyd Kemp, Mrs. Fred L. Black and Mrs. William T. Gossett.

THE DRIVE was given an official send-off at a luncheon Monday for committee chairmen at the Veteran's War Memorial. The orchestra can appeal to the public for funds with the soundest of arguments this year. It has lived up to the most optimistic of expectations in this first year of its reorganization.

J. B. Ford, president of the Symphony Board, stated that the purpose of the campaign is to assure the permanency of the orchestra.

In explaining the need for the campaign he said, "new money must be added each year to the Maintenance Fund and many more new names must be added to the list of business and industrial firms, foundations and individuals who joined last season to launch the project."

"We want everyone in the community to play an active part in the orchestra which serves them."

DURING THE YEAR, the Symphony played 18 evening concerts to an audience of over 85,000. It performed 5 Sunday afternoon Family Concerts for over 10,000.

In its school concert series, it played to more than 40,000 young people, many of whom had never heard a full symphony orchestra.

Continuing the policy of enlisting the support of individual small contributions and establishing an even broader base of interest, the campaign is aimed at the thousands who enjoyed the orchestra this past season.
