

**West Maple Sewer Line To Be Rerouted Under New Bridge Construction**

Upon the recommendation of City Engineer L. R. Gare, the eight-inch storm sewer for the Maple-Southfield area will be rerouted under the new West Maple bridge.

Gare said after careful investigation by his department it appears that by relocating about

225 feet of the existing sewer it can be shifted to the north and cross the Rouge river under the new bridge. Gare said that only in extreme high water would the pipe be submerged.

Gare feels the inverted siphon, which had been suggested for the line, would be too costly. He estimated it would amount to about \$4,300 for parts and installation, plus a constant cost for maintenance.

The relocation of the line, under the bridge, Gare estimates at approximately \$2,100. Use Classified Ads—They Sell!

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
