brarian for Southfield Township schools, gave a brief talk on the needs of the library and thanked the Chapter for its annual contribution.

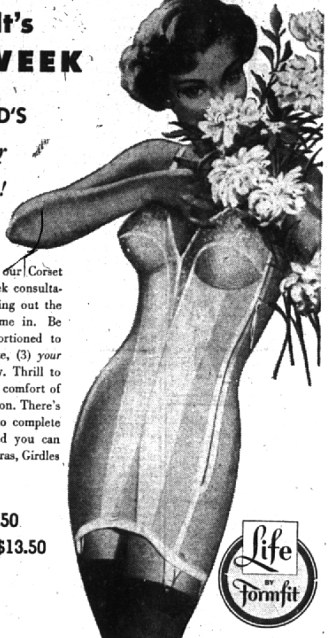
