

**History Professor To Be Unitarian Speaker April 29**

Under the sponsorship of the Unitarian Fellowship of Birmingham, Prof. Preston Slosson will speak on "What the Church Alone Can Do". He will be heard at a dinner meeting in the Community House, beginning at 7 p.m.

Prof. Slosson, a member of Michigan State college staff since 1921, is now professor of modern history. A graduate of Columbia university, he was a Carnegie professor at British universities in Bristol, Manchester, Glasgow, Sheffield and Aberystwyth in 1932-33 and again in 1938-39.

He has worked in creative chemistry and other science and was secretary for the Rollins college conference on atomic power in 1946. Prof. Slosson is also known for his radio broadcasts and has written several history textbooks.
