

Sewage Contracts To Be Cancelled

Notice of cancellation of sewerage treatment contracts as of Sept. 1, 1952, with Oakdale Hills country club, Bloomfield Hills, and Bloomfield Village has been or-

dered by the Birmingham city commission. This action, commissioners explained, is required as a result of a recent state water resources

commission demand that Birmingham take steps by Aug. 1, 1953, to eliminate all pollution of the Rouge river.

Contract cancellations will permit the city to undertake any new disposal arrangements which meet state approval, commissioners point out.

Reserves, Fresh Play A Schedule In New Program

With the school district's ninth graders housed in the new Birmingham high school for the first time this fall, the high school football program has been revamped.

Three separate squads, freshman, reserve and varsity, will play regularly scheduled games throughout the season and no scrimmages between squads is planned.

Each squad will have new uniforms with enough equipment for each team to work independently of one another.

Coach Vince Secontine urges freshman and reserve hopefuls to give as much consideration to their physical conditioning as will be expected of the varsity.

Secontine said that the coaching staff had given much thought to keeping the freshman separate from the other squads and that they believe the new schedule will give each boy a better chance to show their talents.

At the end of the season the coaches may bring up a few of the reserve and freshman players to possibly see action in the annual Thanksgiving Day game with Royal Oak. By this time the staff will have had a good opportunity to watch the work of all players.

Freshman will play a five game schedule on Wednesday nights. The Reserves will also compete in the Eastern Michigan League with five games.
