B'ham Gets \$12,948.99 In Weight Tax Return

Birmingham will receive \$12,948.99 from the state motor vehicle highway fund for the second quarter of 1952, it was announced by the Michigan State Highway Dept. The fund is comprised of the proceeds from gasoline, diesel fuel, weight, and miscellaneous taxes.

Oakland county received \$434,664.01 as its share.

The fund is divided so the state receives 44 percent of fund money, counties receive 19 percent and cities and incorporate villages 17 percent.

New Police Cars

Two new squad cars and a new three-wheeled motorcycle are to be purchased for the Birmingham police department, city commissioners have agreed. Similar old vehicles will be traded in on the new purchases, and the total net cost will be \$1,257.80.

School to Install Gas Pumps; Cancel Present Detroit Edison Agreement.

The Birmingham board of education Tuesday evening, decided to obtain bids from gasoline companies for the installation of tanks and a metering pump at the school garage where its buses are serviced.

Superintendent Dwight B. Ireland pointed out that there were 12,787 gallons of gas used in school vehicles last year. The new system, he explained, will mean a substantial saving to the district.

THE BOARD also voted to cancel the present bulk-exchange agreement with Detroit Edison, in exchange for a six-cent per 100-kilowatt hour reduction in charges.

A number of bulb types, fluorescent lights, etc., are not exchangeable and are bought directly by the board. A saving of about \$500 a year can be established with the new plan, it is estimated.
