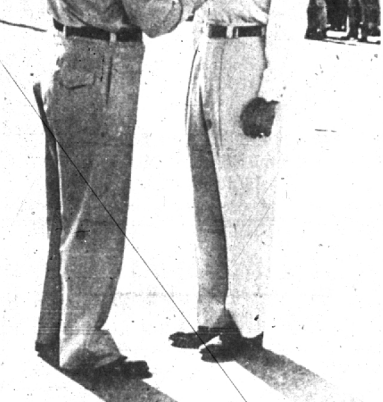

Jet Interceptor Pilot In Alaska

Lt. Edgar K. Beatty, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Beatty, 612 Brookside Drive, is now a member of the 57th Fighter Interceptor Wing, on active duty in Alaska, stationed at Camp Elmendorf near Anchorage.

In a recent letter to his parents, he states one cannot help being impressed by the alertness and efficiency of Elmendorf, also the rapid growth of Anchorage toward big city status.
