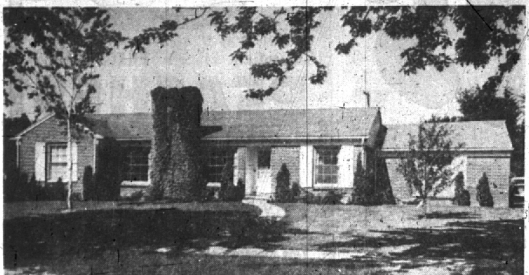

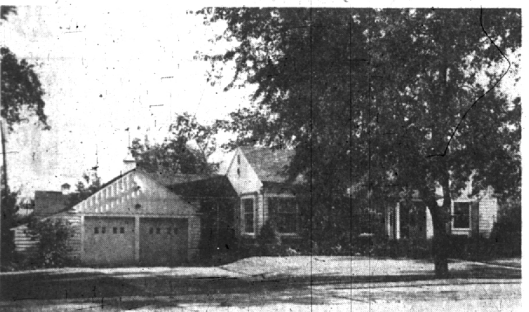

European Bike Trip Creates Big Appetite

Nancy Morse, daughter of the J. J. Morses of 675 Eton, will carry a great many pleasant memories with her when she enters Denison university at Granville, Ohio, this fall. Nancy, a June graduate of Birmingham high school, is on a bicycle tour of Europe at present, one of a large group of students seeing the country "first hand."

The trip started for her at Montreal when she boarded the Great liner "Columbia," along with some 300 other passengers. The trip was a busy one, with about 95 per cent of the passenger list being made up of students.

Nancy joined the main tour at Southampton, seeing many of the sights of England before leaving for the continent. Letters to her parents told of the trip to the famed Wax Works, Piccadilly, Hyde Park, Westminster Abbey and Buckingham Palace, where she watched the changing of the guard.

Her stay in England also gave her a glimpse of Prince George and Prince Charles, Big Ben, No. 10 Downing street, the London tower and bridge, and an evening at the London Symphony orchestra.

"NANCY SAID the English bikes were light and because of the three gears, easy to ride. The trip covered 60 miles the first day, ending at a Youth Hostel.

"I'm dirty and aching. And hungry! I'm going to sleep on my tummy tonight."
 Nancy said the people of England were very friendly toward all of its members.

It is interesting to note that St. Malo, France, was the starting point of their continental jaunt. This community was "adopted" by Birmingham at the end of the war.

"The first day in France the waitress brought us all these funny little fishes with tiny shells and whiskers. We proceeded to eat them all down and when the waitress came back she nearly died because she couldn't find any shells. We were supposed to have devilled them! Oh, well!"

The last letter received by her parents was just before the group started for Nice. In it Nancy said they were all having some difficulty trying to figure out the money system, as well as properly ask for food.

"The students will see sections of Italy, Germany, Holland, Switzerland and Belgium before returning to England late this month to start the trip home.

"NANCY WILL have just a few days before she has to leave for college," Mrs. Morse said. "I suppose she's so used to rushing about by now that it won't bother her at all."
