He also advocates the establishment of a fire department for the east side of the township, claiming that because of the distance, the present department is inadequate to handle alarms properly.

OBERLIN ADDED that he feels the duties now shared by the police and fire departments leave the township without proper police protection.

He approves the establishment of 24-hour police protection and the enlargement of the department personnel. Two-way radio is another step he feels should be adopted.

Oberlin declared that the building code should be self-supporting and that the township should have adequate personnel to see that regulations are enforced.

"All these can be done without any increase in taxes," he said, "by modernizing the present system and economizing. Any additional taxes necessary will be available from the increase in the number of new homes being built here."
