The fire-place repeated the colors in swags of greens tied with big red satin bows.

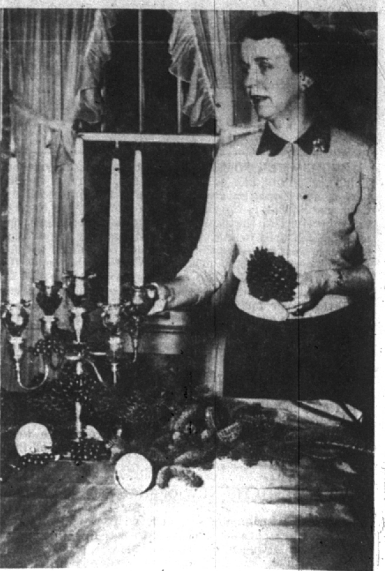
DEPARTING FROM custom, the show was unjudged. Displays featured traditional family holiday decorations, ranging from tea tables, buffets, mantles and door-ways.

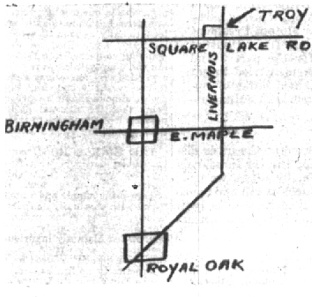
Committees for the coming year will be appointed by the new president. No further meetings are scheduled for the group until Monday, Jan. 5, 1953.

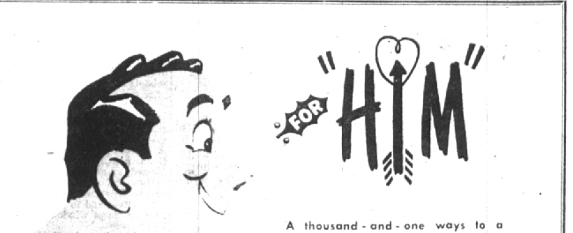
