THE PROGRAM will conclude with a presentation of art pictures by Mrs. William A. Shaver.

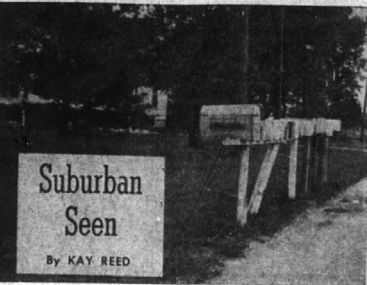
Bargar-Aubrey Troth Is Told

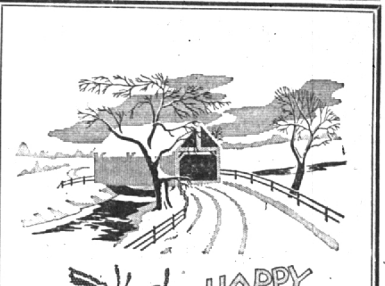
BROWNIE TROOP 441
