THE EAST section of the city geographically lies within the Clinton-Red Run drainage district and city officials have been exploring the possibility of joining the (SOCSD) to take the sewage from this side of the city direct to Detroit's treatment plants.
 To date, Birmingham has every assurance that such a membership in the SOCSD would be approved by other member municipalities and the county, and have also formulated fairly accurate figures on the cost of membership.
 Now the city wonders whether the voters will favorably receive such a move. Under the city charter, a two-thirds affirmative vote of the people must be gained before the city can contract with other municipalities for such a joint undertaking.

THE CITY is hurrying negotiations to join the SOCSD in the hope that the contract may be submitted to the voters in the spring election.
 A similar proposal on the August 2 primary ballot was turned down by voters. One of the points of known opposition to the project at that time was the lack of accurate figures on the cost of joining the SOC body.
 Under present negotiations with the other SOC communities and the county, the city figures the cost of assuming the city's share of the district's assets from May 1, 1944 to December 31, 1951 would amount to \$21,091.34. This would include interest and a 10 per cent margin of error in determining the city's water consumption.

WITH THE east side of the city served by the SOC authority, the city states that the present disposition would be better able to handle the remainder of the city's wastes without building additions to the building.
 Egbert reported that the annual cost of the city's SOCSD membership in rates for the city as a whole should be near \$15,000 for the next seven years, when it is estimated its SOCSD bond issue will be paid off.
 He promised no immediate increase in rates. As the city as approved, but added that rates would not increase and would tend to decrease over future years.
 It now costs the city 10 cents per 1,000 gallons to treat sewage. Detroit can handle sewage with least treating for six cents per thousand gallons.

EGBERT STATED that the city would ultimately pay in about \$50,000 to the SOC authority's \$905,000 project. Birmingham's proportionate share of the district would be between three and four per cent.
 When questioned by commissioners what the outcome would be if the city did not join the authority, Egbert admitted that the city did not have the answer.
 The Rouge River is not of sufficient size to accommodate any larger amounts of treated effluent, he explained.
 "To enlarge the present plant would cost the city hundreds of thousands of dollars and we would still be faced with the operating costs of over-treating the sewage so that no further pollution would be allowed to enter the river," Egbert said.

WHEN QUESTIONED on the source of finances for the SOCSD membership, Egbert said the city's sewage disposal department has \$40,000 in surplus funds that could be used for this purpose.
 To gain county approval of the plan, the proposal must first be granted by the Oakland County Board of Supervisors. The city is making every effort to get this matter on the board's January 13 agenda.
 Meanwhile, city representatives will take the project up with the supervisors' drain committee.
 The cities of Oak Park, Royal

Oak and Ferndale already have approved the cost figures of Birmingham's membership.
 Other municipalities have promised to submit the proposals to their governing bodies.
 Egbert explained to commissioners that it would be a fairly easy job to tie in with the SOC drainage system.

In some places the lines are already connected," Egbert said. "It offers it would merely be a matter of knocking out existing plugs in the lines."
