Lawrence, soccer coach, awarded letters to the following thirteen boys: Harry Lomason, Al Rubiner, John Schwartz and Ralph Himmelhoch, all of Detroit; John Wert and Phil LeMessurier of Bloomfield Hills, and Leo Butzel of Birmingham.

Letter winners from outside of Detroit were Grant Griswold of Midland, Charlie Chapman of Rochester, and Roper Staples of Ann Arbor. Out-of-state letter winners were Bob Reed of Lake Forest, Illinois, Bob Godfrey of Long Island, New York, and Jon Thompson of Columbia, Missouri.

LEAVING THE list of letter winners was Harry Lomason, Harry, captain for the past two years, played full-back for the team after holding down one of the half-back positions last year. He has been on the squad since his freshman year and has won three letters in soccer plus one each in hockey and baseball.
