Church Scene of Christmas Program

AN ORGAN RECITAL and selections by the string quartet will complete the program which begins at two o'clock.

The string quartet is composed of Axel Magnuson, first violin; Sandra Bernal, second violin; Ruth Killen, viola; and Marjorie Bernal, cello.

Magnuson has charge of instrumental music at Cranbrook School. Miss Bernal, Birmingham High School student, studies violin with Mischa Mischakoff, concert master of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

Ruth Killen received her master of music degree from Kansas University. Mrs. Bernal, Sandra's mother, was a member of the Indianapolis Symphony before moving to Birmingham.

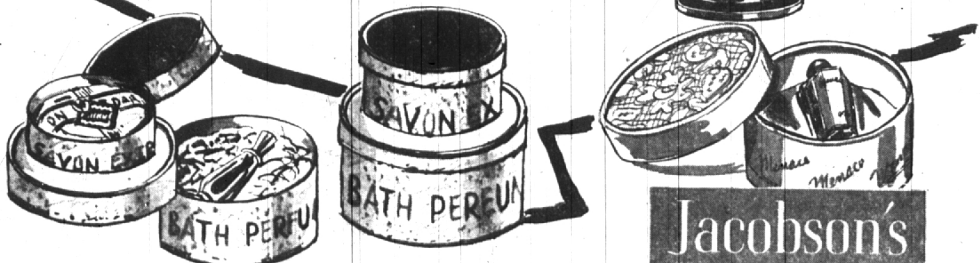
