Art Students Show Wares At 8th Annual Exhibition

The work of a year is on display at the Cranbrook Academy of Art as students hold their eighth annual exhibition through December 7.

In addition to Christmas cards, works from the departments of ceramics, weaving, painting, metal-smithing, sculpture, design and graphics will be shown in the lower gallery of the art academy museum daily except Monday from two until five o'clock, and Friday and Saturday evenings from eight until ten.

who have items in the sale include Anne Chapman, this year's winner of the top prize for ceramic sculpture in the National Ceramic Exhibition at Syracuse, N. Y. She will offer pottery, sculpture and printed textiles.

Sue Rovelstad, who has appeared in 13 national exhibitions and won prizes at the Brooklyn Museum, the Library of Congress, and the West Michigan Artists Exhibition, will show paintings and prints, including one selected for this year's Metropolitan Museum Exhibition of prints and drawings.

Jewelry and dinnerware will be

offered by Paul Evans, Cranbrook scholarship student who has won three first prizes in national metal-work competitions during the past two years.

SCULPTOR Gabriel Koh, a veteran of 21 exhibitions in Europe and America, including two one-man shows in Rome, will display small terra cotta sculptures and drawings.

Azella Thorpe and Dorothy Gaymer, both of whom have won prizes in international weaving competitions, will include woven goods of various styles and sizes.

Ceramist Tashiko Takaku of Hawaii and Louis Ginet of Switzerland will display some of their latest pottery designs, and Nils Jorgenson of Norway, who has exhibited throughout Europe, will offer wooden salad sets and ceramics.

Regina Yanich, award winner in the current Michigan Artists Show, will exhibit paintings.

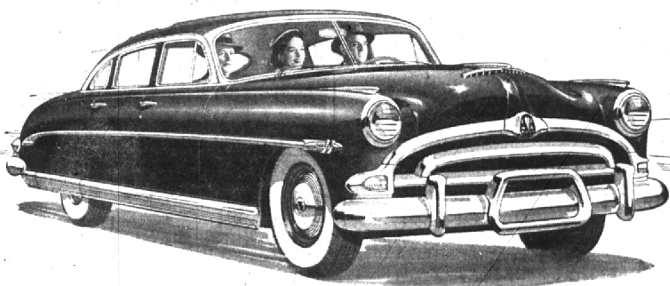
