B'ham Detective To Conduct Class At Police School

Birmingham Police Detective Merlin Holmquist, has been selected as one of the instructors of the in-training police school which started Tuesday. Other instructors will be selected from among police officials, attorneys and special agents of the FBI. Classes will be held at Grosse Pointe Park, Highland Park, Lincoln Park and Birmingham.

Holmquist will be in charge of the class on laws of search and seizure. The studies will include traffic direction, laws of evidence, search of persons, tactics and mechanics of arrest, scientific aids to criminal detection and accident investigation.

This is the second in a series of three courses which will provide 90 hours of special training during the year.

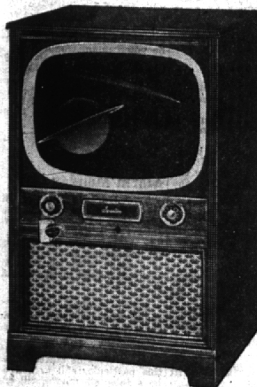
