 Nine members of the First Presbyterian church of Birmingham attended the Feb. 13 meeting of the National Council of Presby-

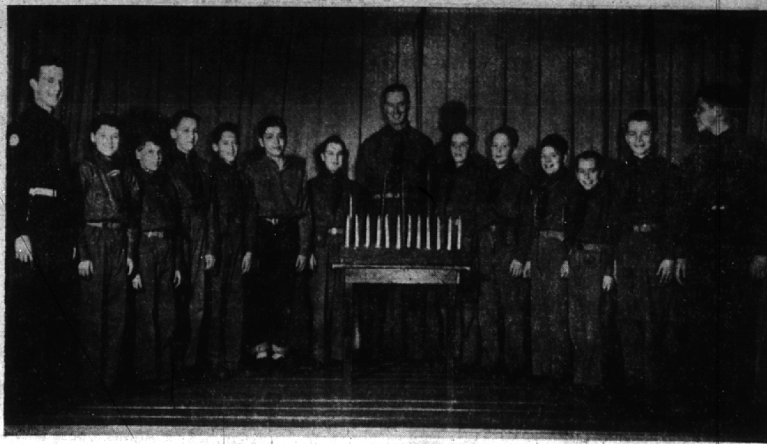

**Deficiency Roll Necessary for Willits Paving**

Before the city commission approves plans to widen Willits street between Woodward and Bates, a meeting will be held between City Engineer L. R. Gare and the five property owners involved.

An original assessment district for this project was confirmed in 1947 and amounted to \$3,551. However, a deficiency roll of approximately \$2,200 is needed.

Bob Bany, representing Bany Brothers, appeared at Monday's meeting and asked why parking was taken off Willits between Chester and Woodward.

Police Chief Ralph Moxley said it was removed at the suggestion of the traffic engineers to obtain better traffic circulation around this block. The chief and the Bany brothers will meet to discuss the matter further.
