On the newlyweds' departure for Chicago where they spent their honeymoon, the new Mrs. Hall wore a costume of winter white trimmed in black velvet.

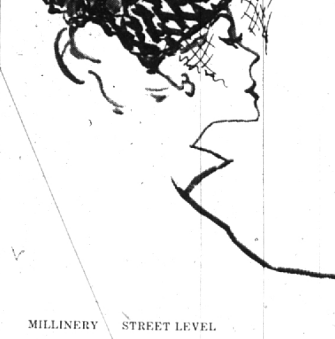
THEY ARE NOW in residence at the University of Illinois where the groom is completing his graduate work. They will return to make their home at Torch Lake in June.
