

Because the Eton road sewer cannot service properties outside the corporate limits, \$4,625.15 charged against two areas is being written off Birmingham accounts.

The sum of \$2,011.30 has been carried as a charge against property north of Derby and east of Eton roads. The Peritts property charge was \$2,523.85. City officials pointed out that the capacity of the Eton drain is insufficient to handle present commitments, without placing two additional loads on the system.
