**Maple Cagers Seek to Stop Kramer Friday**

East Detroit's record smashing cagers invade Birmingham Friday night with a team that is currently rated one of the top 10 quintets in the state.

Led by junior center and all-state candidate Ron Kramer, the Shamrocks have chalked up 10 victories in 13 contests, losing only to Hamtramck once and Ferndale twice, both of the latter by only one point.

A six-foot four-inch, 220-pound giant, Kramer is the leading class A scorer in the state, averaged close to 23 points a game. He tallied 30 points against the Maples in an earlier game this year.

EAST DETROIT HAS clinched second place in the Eastern Michigan league, the highest the Shamrocks have ever finished, and will be seeking a victory over the Maples to climax one of the most successful seasons in the school's history.

On the other hand, Birmingham will try to avenge a earlier defeat by the Shamrocks. In that contest, the Maples led until mid-way in the third quarter, when three regulars fouled out.

East Detroit came from behind to win 88-81, setting a school record for the greatest team point total for a single game, and a league record for the most points scored by two teams in a single contest.

A victory will assure the Maples of third place in the league standings.

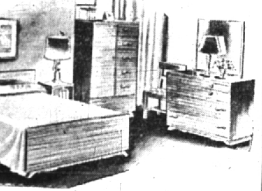

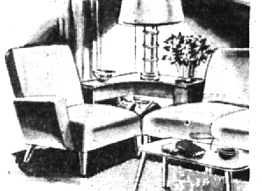
