The attention of the Ruth Shain International Relations Class will shift to Italy at the Tuesday, March 4, session when the class will hear Mr. and Mrs. Hugo Rolland of Milford, Michigan.

Mr. Rolland is a newspaper man who has lived in Rome and Paris and lectured throughout Italy and France. The talk will be accompanied by colored slides.

Mr. and Mrs. Rolland spent three months last winter traveling throughout Italy. They spent time in both industrial and rural areas, meeting and talking with factory workers, miners, farmers, writers, actors, educators, statesmen and the unemployed.

The Rollands visited the adult educational centers which have developed in the past five years and which have gained international recognition. These centers, of popular culture are supported by voluntary contributions from Italy, Switzerland, Denmark, Norway and the United States.

They also visited pilot agricultural areas in the eroded south, as well as welfare centers and clinics in Rome.
