## Maple Swimmers Take EML Title

Qualifying 16 men for the finals, the Birmingham high school swim team walked off with its fourth consecutive Eastern Michigan league championship last week at Ferndale.

In winning, the Maples rolled up a 70 point total with Mt. Clemens second with 53; Hazel Park 48; Ferndale 41; and league doormat Port Huron with nine points. Coach J. J. Myers' team had at least one man in every event with as many as three or four in some.

THE MAPLES JUMPED to a quick lead after the 50 yard free style in which Gary Osterbeck and Jim Newman finished one-two, several strokes in front of the rest of the field. The 200 yard free style was a real battle with Buckholz, Mt. Clemens, edging out Ferndale's Lee McLaughlin and Maple Ted Schwarz to set a new league record of 2:34.7. The old record was set last year by McLaughlin at 2:40.9.

Birmingham also placed one-two in the backstroke with Jerry Fletcher and Bruce Terry proving to be the league's best.

The 100 yard freestyle was easily the most exciting event of the evening. Maple captain Marc Joslyn and Ferndale ace Leroy Fiske matched strokes for three and one-half lengths before Joslyn pulled ahead to win by scant inches. In the afternoon Joslyn qualified a tenth of a second faster than Fiske. In the preliminaries, Fiske set a new league record of 1:52.0 in the individual medley but in the finals he was disqualified for using an illegal kick. The former record of 1:56.7 was set by Ted Harper, Birmingham, in 1949.

BIRMINGHAM COMPLETELY dominated the diving centering four divers against a total of four from all the other league schools. Maple Larry Coleman's total of 125.7 was two-tenths of a point higher than that of second place winner Don Carlos of Mt. Clemens.

The Mt. Clemens freestyle relay team lowered the record of 1:47.8 set by Birmingham last year to 1:47.5. In all, three league records were broken in what proved to be a fast meet.

Port Huron was unable to qualify anyone for the finals and earned its only points on the efforts of its relay team which finished last both times.

Fast Detroit has no pool and therefore was unable to enter a team.

Rogers is high man in this year's senior class with an academic average of 92.1. He has consistently maintained honor grades during his three years at Cranbrook and also won honorable mention in the Southeastern Michigan Scholastic Writing Awards Contest for a literary article.

### Defeat Nichols School; Lose To Patterson

Patterson of Windsor defeated the Cranbrook Varsity Basketball Team 72-58 last week in an away game. The Canadian team is the only team this year to defeat the Cranes twice.

Patterson led 19-12 in the first quarter and increased this lead to 37-27 at the end of the half. The Cranes fell apart in the final half and lost to a spirited Patterson five. Junior center, Bob Godfrey, led all the covers with 26 points while Newton of Patterson closely followed him with 23 points.

NICHOLS SCHOOL of Pittsburgh, Pa. came to Cranbrook Saturday, supporting a 12-1 season record and a 3-0 Inter-State League record. However, a spirited Crane five won by a decisive 54-43.

The first quarter put the Cranes ahead 15-11. However, Nichols came back in the second quarter an inspired ball club and tied the Cranes at the end of the half 22-22.

Cranbrook, playing without starting center Bob Godfrey, got back in the third quarter and pulled ahead 40-34. During the fourth quarter, the Cranes never let down as they defeated the former league leaders 54-43. Bob Nevey of Cranbrook scored 25 points to boost his season record to 276 points in 15 games.

Next week, the Cranes travel to Western Reserve Academy for their final league encounter.
