Edison to Show Proper Lighting Method for Home How good home lighting can literally be tape-measured will be the attraction at an open house at Edison's Birmingham office all day Friday, Feb. 29. The public is invited.

Typical home activity centers - kitchen, dining room and study desk will be displayed. How they can be light conditioned will be shown by actually measuring height of portable lamps, their distance from points of attention, etc.

Visitors will be able to study the displays, and will be given a booklet with which they will be able to check their own home lighting to see how it can be improved to meet modern lighting standards.

A light-meter, the most accurate means for measuring correct lighting, seldom is available to the average homeowner. Most homes do have tape-measure and yardstick, and knowing that, a practical, rule-of-thumb method of using these common household tools for judging levels of illumination has been devised.

THE DISPLAYS and the booklet will show how to use this measuring method in different rooms and for different tasks. "We can show anyone a good way to do this, just using a tape measure, in our light conditioning center," was the statement of

Claude Morrow, manager of the Birmingham office. The Edison open house at Birmingham will be from 8:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. Edison home service advisors will be ready to discuss individual lighting problems with any home owner.

Laird Describes Landscaping Plans for Baldwin Area Edward Laird, local landscape architect has described to the Birmingham board of education the proposed landscaping of the area around Baldwin and Hill schools. The plan calls for separate playground areas for kindergarten youngsters and older children attending Baldwin school, which would fit in well with any summer recreation program.

Kindergarten children would be separated from the older group by a four-foot chain link fence to cut down the chances for injury. The playground equipment there would be scaled to fit their needs. This section would be blacktopped.
