"Survival in the Twentieth Century" is the topic Dr. Gordon H. Scott, dean of the Wayne University College of Medicine, brings to the Birmingham AAUW luncheon Wednesday, February 13, at the Community House.

Dr. Scott came to Wayne University in 1945 to head the department of anatomy from a similar position at the University of Southern California.

His extensive educational background includes a Bachelor's degree at Southwestern College, Kansas, studies at Johns Hopkins, and a Master's and Ph. D. degree from the University of Minnesota, the University of Minnesota, Loyola University, Rockefeller Institute of Medical Research, Washington University and the University of Southern California.

Dr. Scott is the author of numerous articles for medical and science journals. In 1950 he has made dean of the Wayne University Medical School.
