John, son of Mr. and Mrs. John J. Jennings of Ann Arbor, will have W. Beersford Palmer III of Grosse Pointe for his best man.

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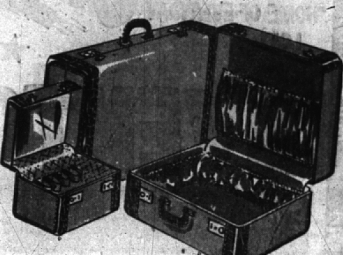
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Puppets to Have Two Busy Nights
