General Motors Executive to Retire in Sept.

William M. Phillips, 19201 Beverly Hills, has been succeeded by Cleveland F. Nixon as head of the General Motors Research Electro-Chemistry department, according to Charles L. McCuen, GM Vice-President and General manager of the Research Laboratories division.

Phillips will continue on the Research Laboratories executive staff until his retirement in September.

The Beverly Hills resident joined General Motors in 1921 as an advisor on plating, painting and enameling in production engineering.

HE HAS WRITTEN a number of articles for technical magazines and has obtained patents on electroplating and rubber applications processes. As head of the electro-chemistry department he has done research on rubber and plastics and such electro-chemical operations as plating.

During World War two, Phillips was chairman of the Navy's chromium plating of piston rings and cylinder liners committee and the Army's fungi and bacteria committee. His other activities included service on the rubber committee on military vehicles and interim time committee and the Manhattan project. He also served on the WPB steel section on special problems.

Bloomfield Twp. Schedules Zoning Ord. Hearing

The Bloomfield township board has scheduled a public hearing for Monday, Jan. 14, at 8 p.m. to consider adoption of a zoning ordinance.

Supervisor David Anderson said the proposed ordinance will come under Act 184 of Public Acts of 1942 instead of the present Act 302 of Public Acts of 1937. He pointed out that there will be substantially no changes although there will be some clarifications and a new map. The supervisor stated, "The proposed ordinance will give the zoning board more leeway and a little better power. We've had some difficulties because the east side of the township was zoned after the original ordinance was drawn up. We will now have just one map for the whole township."

Enlargement of City Treasurer's Office Approved

To provide needed space for the accounting section of the city treasurer's office, the city commission has authorized alteration of the facilities.

City Manager Donald C. Egbert explained, "The volume of work in the accounting portion of the treasurer's office has shown a very substantial increase during the past few years. There is additional office space needed."

"To secure this space in the most economical manner, it is suggested that a partition be constructed segregating the end section of the hall to provide a reception office to serve this department."

Estimated cost of this construction is from \$400 to \$450.

NOTICE

SERVICEMEN AND VETERANS HOMESTEAD TAX EXEMPTION

IF YOU ARE:

1. A veteran of the Spanish American War.
2. A veteran of World War No. I and have a service or non service connected disability recognized by the United States Veterans Administration upon which compensation is paid.
3. An active service man.
4. A veteran of World War No. 2 who has been discharged from service within less than one year.
5. A veteran of World War No. 2 who has a service or non service connected disability recognized by the United States Veterans Administration upon which compensation is paid.
6. Unmarried widow of any of above.

Then you are entitled to homestead tax exemption on \$2,000 of assessed value, providing: on January 1, 1952, you owned and occupied the property as a homestead, did not own property assessed at more than \$7,500, make application sometime between January 1st and March 11th, 1952.

Applications may be made at the office of the city assessor, municipal building, who will assist you.

Bring deed or land contract, discharge papers, recent proof of receiving compensation for service or non service connected disability, if you are receiving same.

We respectfully suggest that application be made, as soon after January 1st as possible.
