Standings in the Birmingham YMCA church league lightened as First Methodist church defeated First Presbyterian church 46 to 45 in a double overtime game to move up to third place.

Bob Gasser's basket in the last few seconds of play tied the score and Glenn Ayers came through with a hook shot to seal the victory.

Both teams remained scoreless in the first three minutes of overtime. Ray Dennison potted 12 points for First Presbyterian to lead their offensive while Gasser's 13 markers was the high score of the evening.

CHRIST CHURCH and Southfield United Presbyterian finished their regulation time game in a 24 all deadlock with both teams matching basket for basket in the closing minutes of play.

Each side scored in the first over-time period and Bud Garrison managed to break away for a lay-up shot to cinch victory for Christ church.

Dwight Babcock dropped in 13 points for Christ church while Jim Oaks with 14 points kept Southfield U.P. out in front most of the game.

In the week's feature game, Lathrup Townsite Church eked out a 32 to 29 win over Embury on fourth quarter baskets by Bill Stone and Dave Schmidt.

Lathrup held Embury's Al Fawcett to eight points and Bud Garrison with a 7 point lead and seconds to play.

Ron Ralph's two set shots from the outer court lessened the gap but time ran out before the Embury scoring became a real threat. The win preserved Lathrup's undefeated record of four wins without a loss.

YMCA Varsity Downed 60-48 By St. Antoine

Birmingham YMCA Varsity dropped a 60 to 48 decision to St. Antoine 'Y' of Detroit on the Barum Junior High floor Thursday and tumbled from a tie for first place to third in the league standings.

Birmingham 'Y' chose to use a man-to-man close press offensive and this paid off in the first quarter when the Dark Green enjoyed a 11 to 8 point advantage.

In the second quarter, St. Antoine began using floor plays designed to pull Birmingham away from the basket and netted 22 points while holding the locals to 8.

SCORE AT THE HALF was 30 to 19 in favor of St. Antoine. In the third quarter, Birmingham went into a semi-zone defense and managed to hold the Detroiters while knotting the score at 35 all.

This was short lived as the visitors using Chuck Fowler at the post position made three lay-up shots in succession to take a lead which they never relinquished.

Jim Stonestreet and Tom Best scored 20 points between them and dominated play for St. Antoine. Al Larsen and John Sincic scored 15 and 12 points respectively to lead the locals offense.

Birmingham 'Y' lacked control of the backboards and failed to use one of its best weapons, rebound shots, to stem the visitors' scoring spree. This fault and failure to sink but 8 of 23 foul shots made the difference in the decision.

The Dark Green meets Northwestern 'Y' on its court Thursday evening.

State Legislature Considers Bill for Fourth Circuit Judge

The State house judiciary committee has favored a bill introduced by Rep. William S. Broomfield of Royal Oak, which would create a fourth circuit court judgeship in Oakland county.

The bill would provide for a general election to select the additional judge.

Discussion is scheduled this week in both the house and senate on Broomfield's bill. Present circuit judges in the county are Frank L. Doty, George B. Hartwick and H. Russel Holland.
