Quarton Lake Treatment Cost City \$2,443.67

Cost to the city of ridding Quarton Lake of algae and weed growth this past summer was \$2,443.67, according to a report submitted to the city commission by City Manager Donald C. Egbert.

Original appropriation was for \$985, which was the amount estimated by Dr. Bernard Domagala for application of chemicals to clean the lake.

Later Domagala was authorized to treat the weed growth at a cost of \$2,000. In addition, Egbert said there was work involved in picking up dead fish and cleaning up around the lake area.

THE ORIGINAL appropriation account for the work was over-expended by \$1,458.67. Monday evening the commission appropriated this amount from the contingent fund to clear the account.

Egbert stated, "A determination should be made by the commission in regard to the desirability of continuing the application of chemicals during the 1952 season in order that arrangements can be made for the work prior to the weeds attaining full growth."

He concluded, "Should the commission decide to continue this treatment, an appropriation should be made from the contingent fund to the account for algae control in Quarton Lake in the amount of \$1,500."

The city manager stated he was not yet ready to make recommendations for the 1952 cleaning.

Noted Pianist to Appear At Detroit's Town Hall

Glaude D'Attili, pianist, will make his Detroit debut at Town Hall Wednesday morning, Jan. 30 at 11 o'clock in Fisher theater.

D'Attili was honored when he was chosen by Toscanini as guest soloist with the NBC Symphony, playing the Concerto in B Flat Minor. Toscanini described his performance as "magnificent!"

He first attracted critical notice when, at the age of six, he made his professional debut before the members of his native Rome's Press club. When he was nine years old, his father brought him to the United States and during the next few years, the boy prodigy gave over 50 concerts.

D'Attili's program at Town Hall will include Mendelssohn's Rondo Capriccioso, Beethoven's Sonata, Op. 31, No. 3; and some of Chopin's more popular works. He will conclude the concert with Polonaise in G Major by Liszt.
