Township Supervisor Norman R. Barnard said that almost all areas in Troy are now represented on the board.

With the opening of the two-day drive for blood donations, several hours remain free for "walk-in" donors, according to co-sponsors, the Birmingham American Legion and its Auxiliary.

A Red Cross blood bank team will be at the Community House today from 3:15 to 4:45 p.m., and 5:30 to 8:45, for those who have not made appointments for donating. The Feb. 1 hours for "walk-ins" are noon to 1:30 and 1:45 to 4 p.m.

Spokesmen for the two organizations are winding up their campaign for donors by telephone and mail contacts. Community House also been made through local service clubs, churches, city commissioners and schools.

SEVERAL GROUPS have expressed their willingness to have the blood bank, including a small nearby factory, where employees are being given time off that all may visit the bank.

At Monday's Birmingham commission meeting Mayor L. B. Biear asked the support of that group and other city employees.

Planners Discuss 14 Mile-Pierce Shopping Center

Plans for future parking accommodations and further development of the Pierce-14 Mile road shopping center were discussed by the city plan board last week Wednesday.

The area now has one store at the northeast corner and three west of Pierce. Parking is provided at the front of the stores.

Merchants from the area and plan board members seemed to agree that there was a need for further development of a shopping center there and other more adequate parking provisions.

CITY MANAGER DONALD C. EGBERT pointed out, "Fourteen Mile road is destined to become a major artery. When that happens, parking in front of the shops won't be desirable."

Dom S. Caputo who owns a market in this development, said he favored parking at the rear of the shopping center. He also pointed out that further stores in this location would be very desirable but they should conform to the appearance of the area and be a credit to the area.

He added, "We don't want anything but a well planned development."

The board agreed to prepare a plan to guide the development of the business area which will include provisions for adequate parking.

After the study is made, the property owners will be asked to discuss the matter further with the board.
