

Zoning Changes Proposed in Troy Township

Proposed zoning recommendations which will set up three residential zones in Troy township were submitted to the township board by the zoning board Monday evening.

Supervisor Norman R. Bernard said the zoning group was authorized to hold public hearings for the affected areas.

First hearing is scheduled Thursday, Feb. 14, at 7:30 for residents in the northwest section.

The board's recommendations are:

(1) ALL AREAS WITHIN sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 12, 18, 19 and 20 (northwest and outside area) and outside of presently established proprietary and supervisors subdivisions are to be divided into residential building sites of not less than two acres, and dwellings should be limited to R-4 classification (not less than 1,000 square

(2) All areas within Sections 1 to 16 and 21 to be divided into residential building sites of not less than one-half acre (not less than 80 foot frontage). Dwellings are to be limited to an exterior ground floor area of not less than 708 feet for one story dwellings. (northeast section)

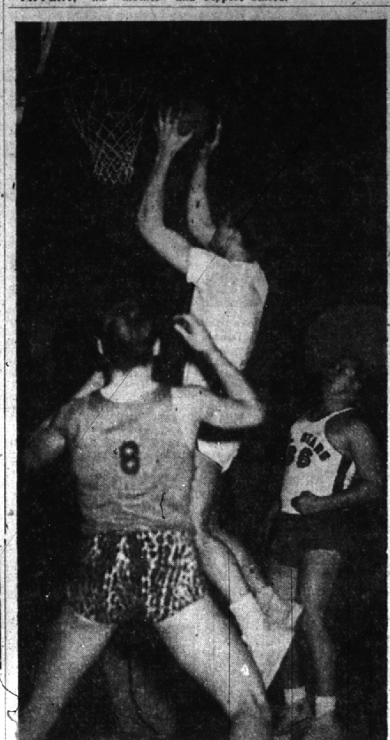
(3) All areas in sections 22-29 and 31-36 should be divided into residential building sites. This doesn't include industrial areas and presently established proprietary and supervisors subdivisions.
