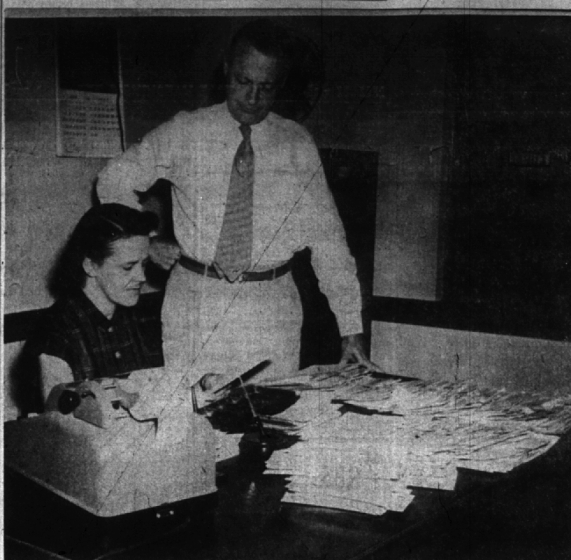

**General Explains Need of 24-Hour Spotters' Duty**

Acting upon the orders of Gen. Nathan F. Twining, Acting Air Force chief of staff, Birmingham will join other Ground Observer Corps Posts in maintaining a 24-hour watch, beginning July 14.

Richard Dewey, local head of GOC operations, said a "strip" exercise was slated for Birmingham for Wednesday and Thursday of this week. The post will be manned from 6 to 8 each evening as a practice and briefing session for workers.

Speaking before a group of Civil Defense directors who had protested an earlier order for round-the-clock duty, Gen. Twining said the action was to avoid, if possible, another Pearl Harbor.

"The need has been apparent," he said, "since Communist Russia and non-Communist countries began their steady drifting apart."

"We know that Russia has more than four hundred long-range bombers, any one capable of delivering a bomb load to any strategic city in the United States. We also know that Russia has a stock pile of atomic bombs."

"We, in the United States, must be prepared. Let us hope and pray that maintaining a 24-hour and night watch with Ground Observers can help us avoid another Pearl Harbor."

**School District May Buy Gasoline Tanks, Pumps**

Birmingham's school board is preparing a study and report on the advisability of buying bulk gasoline and operating pumps.

The action was taken as a result of a reduction of gas allowances by the state. In addition to lower allocations for regular service of buses, the state will no longer give any funds save for home-to-school transportation.

Board members discussed the advisability of renting pumping equipment as compared to buying the pumps outright. The final decision was tabled until Norman, Okla. assistant superintendent, can prepare a report showing gallonage used and current costs.
