Down to Earth

These July days there are many tasks to be done in the garden. Water conservation is very important for your town as well as your garden. Water only in the morning to avoid maximum evaporation and by watering at this hour you prevent mildew on the leaves of phlox and lilies. It also helps to prevent the spread of black spot.

Summer mulch should perhaps be mentioned a few weeks due to its importance. Use peat moss around roses after feeding them with fertilizer. Use sawdust as a mulch around the remainder of the yard after adding one cup of ammonium sulfate to each bushel of sawdust. If you use sawdust alone it will "grab" the nitrogen in the soil and the growth of plants will be affected. Ammonia will lose their lower leaves, a minimum of bloom will appear.

Pruning time is here. You may wish to remove a lower branch of a tree due to it curbing the light or sun from a favorite flower bed. Cut close to the trunk and be sure to paint over the wound with one of the commercial paints for that purpose to avoid disease at this vulnerable location.

FLOWERING SHRUBS are pruned after their blooming period due to the fact that the earlier bloomers form their buds on last year's growth. Mock oranges and wicketia can be pruned in the Spring because they flower

trimmed after their blooming period, too. Examine the entire growth and take out the older wood to assure a maximum show next spring. This fall is too late for best results.

SHRUB ROSES which grow tall and have the habits of shrubs, should also be trimmed at this time to keep the plant healthy. Sweet Alyssum and sweet geranium should be clipped at intervals to prevent it from going to seed.

Clematis should be given a generous summer mulch as it must have cool feet to prosper. Many new lawns have been put in this manner. They may look mangy for a couple of weeks but soon the new branches will form a chance and buds will form on the new plant material for spring flowering. Lawns should be treated right away.

Never butcher a flowering shrub off at the top in trimming it. If you examine a shrub and it has four canes, then take off one cane which appears to be the oldest. Climbing roses should be

all purpose fertilizer you may be sure that all you need is time to give you a yard the neighbors will envy. As your grass grows it will send out roots and spread to form a compact carpet. WATER IN THE MORNING.

ALWAYS HAVE your lawn mower set for two inches in the summer to avoid the growth and spreading of crab grass. Allow grass clippings to go back to the soil. Be sure and check the lawn mower today and see that it is set for two inches.

Night lighting your yard is fun. Secure outdoor cable and remember the rule of not working with outlets when it has just rained and your feet might be wet. This hobby pays off with a real thrill for the gardener. After the day's work is done, and you want to show your guests your garden, turn on the lights. I have found that the green lights do the most for shrubs and trees. Train spotlights upward into the branches of your favorite trees and you will be ready to imagine the tree is a palm in Port Lauderdale.

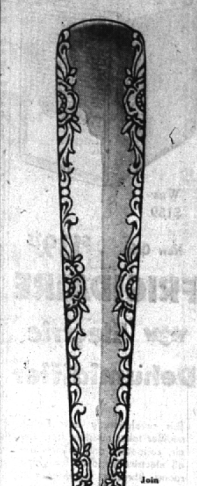
