### Troy Turns Thumbs Down on Annexing

The proposed annexation of 43 acres of Troy township land to the city of Birmingham was unanimously denied by Troy township board members Monday night.

Arthur Nechman, 32321 Arlington, Birmingham builder, owns the property north of Derby, east of the Grand Trunk railroad right-of-way and west of Eton and had proposed to erect 128 homes on the parcel if utilities were made available.

Troy Board Member Fred W. Hildebrandt firmly moved that the petition for annexation be denied.

"I am not in favor of giving any township land away," Hildebrandt stated.

Supervisor Norman Bernard pointed out that more and more township land was being lost to Birmingham.

"And with the land goes our tax base," Board Member Ceville H. Mason concluded.
