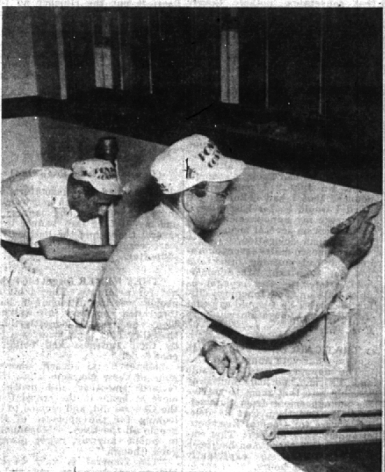

Services Saturday For Crash Victim

Thomas L. Hemsteger, 24, of 1690 Birmingham boulevard, died July 9 in a Bright hospital from injuries received in an accident near new Hudson on Monday. A native of Middletown, Ohio, Mr. Hemsteger was born Dec. 5, 1928 and with his parents moved to Franklin about 12 years ago. The family had been residents of Birmingham since 1949. He was graduated from Baldwin high school in 1947 and from the University of Detroit in 1951. He was employed at the Thureson lumber company in Howell.

MR. HEMSTEGER is survived by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Samuel E. Hemsteger; two brothers, Donald E., of Oak Park and John D., at home; his maternal grandmother, Mrs. Martha Kolbe of Detroit and paternal grandmother, Mrs. Florence Hemsteger of Dayton, Ohio. Rosary services were held from Ball Chapel of the William R. Hamilton company with services Saturday morning from the Shrine of the Little Flower. The Rev. Lucian Hebert, pastor of our Lady Queen of Martyrs parish, of which Mr. Hemsteger was a member, officiated. Burial was in Franklin cemetery.

8408 Families, 28,342 Persons In School Dist.

Total population for the Birmingham school district has been listed at 28,342, according to Mrs. Irene Stevens, district clerk. The adult population figures, tabulated last week, showed a total of 17,886 persons in 8,408 families. In school attendance areas the break-down is: Adams, 1,614 families, 3,467 persons; Baldwin (a newly created district since the transfer of Baldwin from high school to elementary classification), 1,951 and 4,094; Bloomfield Village, 284 and 654; Franklin, 368 and 841; Pierce, 1,750 and 3,590; Quarton, 1,218 and 2,832; Torry, 460 and 1,762; and Walnut Lake, 281 and 591. The census figures for children showed 3,615 under five and 6,842 from 5 through 19, a total of 10,457.

IN RELEASING the figures, Mrs. Stevens stressed that this is not being reported as 100 per cent perfect.

"We may have missed a few persons in our count," she said. "It was a big undertaking for our workers but comparing our report to known and estimated city figures I feel we are very close to a true picture."

"It must be understood that our school census and the city census cannot tally. Our school district takes in Walnut Lake, Franklin and Bloomfield Village as well as those in the Pierce district who are not residents of the City of Birmingham."
