

Hearing Set On Troy Pool

A verbal battle of attorneys brought the Clarita Swimming pool issue to a head in Troy township Monday night and board members called a public hearing for June 29 to determine the fate of the swimming pool's operations.

Residents near the pool at 538 East Long Lake seek an end to the pool's swimming club, protesting that the club is a nuisance and operating in violation of a township ordinance.

John H. Champ, attorney for the property owners, insisted that residents believed the pool to be a private place for the immediate family of Mr. and Mrs. Clary Evans when construction began nearly seven years ago.

WHEN THE POOL began taking private memberships, residents still refused to take action against the owners because they believed that the club would "die a natural death."

"Now the commercial venture has taken on Frankenstein proportions and surrounding property owners, who have their rights, seek an end to the noise and dust the pool brings to this residential neighborhood," Champ declared.

Claims that the pool was operating in violation of the zoning ordinance were found inapplicable since the pool was in operation before the Evans did derive profit from the operation of the pool, the organization of the club was not established on a business basis.

Township Attorney Malcolm Heber concluded the hour-long hearing by stating that under terms of the ordinance a public hearing was in order.

"THIS QUESTION obviously cannot be agreed upon by all those involved," Heber stated, "and the fact that the pool owners could not gain the necessary assent of 51 per cent of the property owners clearly shows that the pool is operating in peril."

The pool membership is limited to 100 members, according to Champ.

Forsythe scoffed at the proposal to revert the pool's activities to four members of the Evans family.

"Who could financially maintain a \$25,000 investment for the pleasure of his immediately family," he asked.

"THE OWNERS have acted in good faith ever since completion of the pool," Forsythe said, "and will cooperate in any reasonable way with the wishes of the neighbors."

Forsythe said that in his opinion ordinance number eight, which calls for the licensing of public places of entertainment, did not apply to the Clarita pool because while the Evans did derive profit from the operation of the pool, the organization of the club was not established on a business basis.

Township Attorney Malcolm Heber concluded the hour-long hearing by stating that under terms of the ordinance a public hearing was in order.
