Normal gravitational flow of wastes would flow south into the SOC District and save the city considerable money in pumping operations to the disposal plant.

**SECONDLY, RELEASE** of this portion of the city's sewage would relieve the present plant for the time when additions could be constructed to it.

City Commissioner Ralph A. Main, who also is county drain commissioner, estimated that it is costing the city of Birmingham 3.5 cents per thousand gallons to transport and treat sewage from the eastern part of the city. Detroit disposal plants could handle the job for six cents per thousand gallons, he believes.

In the Birmingham plant, an expensive four-tank treatment must be given all sewage to assure nearly complete sanitary processing of the waste.

Detroit plants merely give primary treatment to the sewage which is later pumped out into a large moving body of water.

**SUGGESTED PLANS** call for the inclusion of Hill and Bloomfield township in the use of Birmingham's plant. These communities have been asked to find a solution to their sewage disposal problems.

The probable enlargement of the present city plant forms the second part of the sewage problem to be explained in next week's issue.

**Maple Rezoning Now Covers Block**

A petition originally filed by Mike Harabedian and his wife, Anna, 647 Ruffner, for the rezoning of lots 32 and 33 on the north side of Maple between St. Andrews and Coolidge from residential to business has been extended to include the entire north side of the block.

City commissioners Monday night referred the extended petition to the plan board which is studying the rezoning at the present time.

George A. Cram, Pontiac attorney retained by the Harabedians, stated that all property owners in the block, with the exception of three lots owned by the city, have joined in seeking the zoning change.

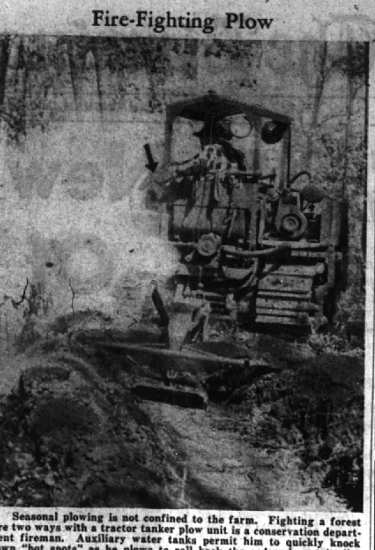
**Board Meets Tuesday**

**Birmingham GOC Rates Well in Opening Week**

Rating among the highest in the state, the Birmingham Ground-Observers Corp maintained an 80 per cent watch during the first week of round-the-clock "Operation Sky-watch."

Richard Dewey, local GOC supervisor, said this week that 192 persons stood the two-hour shifts during the week, bringing the post in the state's top bracket for proper maintenance.

"We rated high last week, but we should rate higher," Dewey said. "We've had a number of men volunteer for duty, and are providing they have passed their twelfth birthdays.

"If some more of our Birmingham area women would volunteer their services, our post would be all set."
