NATURE Now
 A SNAIL'S PACE

A snail is numbered among the lowliest of nature's creatures. It is the symbol of a slow and silent life, to be crushed underfoot on some forest path or at best to be observed in an idle moment, clinging to leaf or garden wall, timid body only half extended from its protective shell. There is no child who has not held such a one in his playful hand, yet even the wisest man knows only a part of what life carries on within the darkness of this small spiral shell.

Snails are only one species of the large family of mollusks whose members occupied the prehistoric seas in such profusion that their fossilized remains have laid down the thick layers of limestone which we use today.

Countless numbers of these are now extinct but some 80,000 species remain to populate both fresh and salt water or to make their slow way over the land. To this family also belong the clams, scallops, cockles and squids, as well as the so-called "cuttle" and "devil" fish of our warm seas.

YESTERDAY, by one of those chance incidents which are always occurring in the days of one who probes nature's ways, I came upon the newly-laid eggs of a snail. I had seen these only once before, hidden within a clump of moss growing on an old stump. But yesterday at day-camp while reviewing some specimens of moss from a collection on a flat dish, I uncovered an odd dozen of translucent eggs, moist and milky white. I had forgotten for the moment that the children had brought in several garden snails which had been free to wander at will. During the night, instinct had impelled one of these to perform its age-old rite, leaving behind its eggs which resemble nothing so much as small perfect peas. If these had been laid in their natural habitat, they would have hatched without further ado; the babies would have fared forth intended to live their own small-lives, each carrying on its back an incomplete shell made up of a single spiral turn.


THE SNAIL is not an adult until at the beginning of its second year when its shell has been completed with a rounded lip. This has been gradually formed by a cerous material secreted from its own body. Without this protection for its soft flesh, it would soon fall in the heat of the sun or fall prey to one of its countless enemies. It retreats and its shell at the slightest sign of danger and blocks the doorway with a mass of mucus. We most often see it thus, the flat coiled spiral appearing as a lifeless and drab as the earth it so closely resembles.

But on a damp day in the small hours of night, the snail puts forth its single foot and goes about its business. Its method of locomotion is unique. It lays its own pavement by depositing a film of mucus upon which it makes its way forward by contracting the muscles of its foot. The "snail's pace" which it travels may average 10 feet per hour and is adequate for a snail's business and social life.

After protruding its foot, the snail extends its head which is equipped with two slender stalks, each trimmed with a single bead-like eye. These can be stretched like a piece of rubber to peer around corners or they can be pulled back into the flesh for protection. Underneath these is another pair of shorter tentacles which act as sensory organs. These it uses constantly to test the surface over which it travels.
