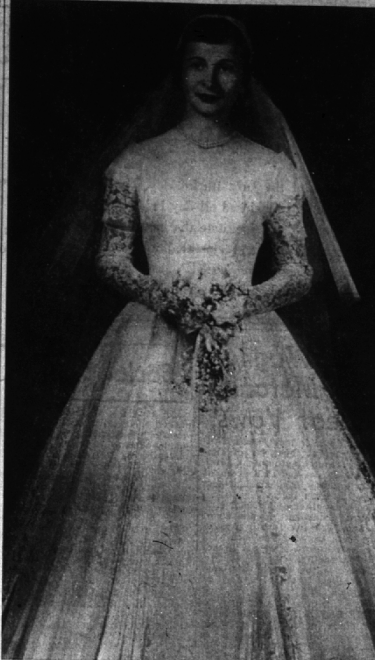
**Summer on Continent For Local Students**
