### Three Proposals On Ballot Before Southfield Voters

One of the three proposals Southfield township voters will ballot on in the state primary Tuesday may be confusing to some voters, according to Township Clerk Fannie Adams.

This is the "re-zoning" ordinance, the last of the three proposals.

It will take a "yes" vote to close the township to hunting for a period of two years.

The proposal, more simply put, asks voters if they favor closing the township to hunting. A "no" vote would indicate the voters desire to keep the township open.

The other two proposals concern the setting up of a civil service commission for township firemen and establishing a pension plan for firemen who have served a required number of years in the department.

WHEN QUINN FOUND that the township still has to build an addition to the city's disposal plant, he charged, "If the Water Resources commission forces Detroit to more thoroughly treat its sewage, then we will have to pay for the enlargement of both Detroit's facilities and our own."

City Manager Donald C. Egbert agreed with Quinn but added that the city would merely stand higher cost of disposal in Detroit and would not have to lay out any capital funds for construction on Detroit's plants.

Egbert continued that "It was important to preserve the Rouge River basin to the City of Birmingham. The stream is a small body of running water, not capable of taking large amounts of even treated sewage."

MULLIN ASKED WHY all the hurry in this matter when no figures are available as yet. "You have really slid this thing under the doorstep pretty fast. We've only had two weeks to study the project before we go to the vote on it," Mullin charged.

Commissioner V. B. Watkins stated that the commission passed the resolution to place the amendment on the ballot on May 28. "Since that time all information we have on the change has been available to those who sought it," Mayor Dean C. Geier, recalling the advance publicity on the fire hall bond issue taken to the voters in April, said, "We were severely criticized for our work in informing the public on the fire hall issue, and decided against publishing a like brochure on this matter."
