Hearing Adjourned On Swimming Pool

The Clarita swimming pool, 538 East Lone Lake road, Troy township, will be allowed to operate until the public hearing, opened Monday night is continued on Sept. 8.

Township board members sat through another lengthy debate between the attorneys representing Mr. and Mrs. Clare Evans, owners of the pool, and the attorney for residents contesting the right of the pool to operate.

Carol Forsythe, defending the pool's stand, stated that the clause of the township's amusement ordinance, that residents feel is being violated, is not mandatory upon the board. This ordinance holds that an amusement site, such as the swimming pool, must have the written approval of 51 per cent of property owners within 1,000 square feet of the site.

The board stipulated that if the pool was to remain open until the September hearing, the loudspeaker must not be used, noise of cars curtailed, and operating hours be held within 11 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily.

The board instructed Township Attorney Malcolm Heber to report on the local aspect of the ordinance, and report his findings to the board Sept. 8.

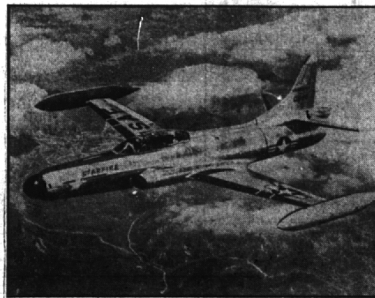
